

# STALKING & DOMESTIC VIOLENCE


All stalkers can be dangerous. On average, intimate partner stalkers pose the greatest threats to their victims.

**85%** of attempted **76%** of completed **INTIMATE PARTNER FEMICIDES** were preceded by **stalking** in the prior year <sup>1</sup>

**2 YEARS** is the average duration of intimate partner stalking. <sup>2</sup>



## WHEN DOES STALKING OCCUR?



Stalking can occur before, during, and/or after a relationship.

**43%** of female **32%** of male **STALKING VICTIMS ARE TARGETED** by (current or former) **INTIMATE PARTNERS** <sup>3</sup>

Victims of intimate partner stalking have

**MORE SEPARATION ATTEMPTS**



than victims of intimate partner violence alone. <sup>4</sup>
